She came to Painting with the Plants with her husband, Andrew, their three-year-old daughter, Alex, and nearly two-year-old son, Theo. Benson appreciated how the conservatory offered a safe, enclosed space for her family to explore.



"Being outdoors has always been grounding for Alex," she said, and continued with:

"The conservatory felt like the perfect mix—an expansive but secure space for the kids to roam."

Benson shared how the planned activity, combined with the opportunity to walk through the conservatory together afterward, made the event especially memorable.

"The painting and then walking around—we really enjoyed that—and also being around plants, being as close to nature as possible. It was a very calming yet interactive and centering experience for them."

"When we walked away, my husband and I both said it was our most favorite Easterseals outing. We absolutely loved it."
