The Illinois Autism Partnership (IAP) provides information on the upcoming total solar eclipse, a fun crown activity to do with your students or children, and much more.

An exciting natural phenomenon is on the way this Monday, April 8th: a Total Solar Eclipse!

A total solar eclipse happens when the Moon passes between the Sun and Earth, completely

blocking the face of the Sun. Chicago and its surrounding suburbs are expected to have a 94% totality. A total solar eclipse won't happen again in the U.S. for 20 years, so don't miss the opportunity to experience the eclipse for yourself! Just make sure you do so safely as the rays can be severely damaging to eyes without proper protection.
